WREATH LAYING CEREMONY



Chen Guangcheng

For more than 25 years, Chen Guangcheng has exposed the reality of human rights in China, defending those who have had no voice. Born in China during the country's violent Cultural Revolution, Chen went blind before his first birthday which made him a member of one of China's most discriminated-against groups: the disabled. He taught himself law and started raising

concerns and petitions about the treatment of China's disabled population. Chen's fight expanded to land rights, corruption, and China's one-child policy. Chen's activism and willingness to challenge the authorities got him arrested. He was sentenced to four years in prison in 2006. After his release in 2010, Chen was put under house arrest. In 2012, Chen made a daring escape and journey to the U.S. Embassy in Beijing where he sought asylum. The U.S. government negotiated with the Chinese Communist Party for Chen's release, and succeeded. He was deemed a prisoner of conscience by Amnesty International and listed as one of Time Magazine's 100 most influential people in the world. Since beginning his advocacy work, Chen has been the recipient of numerous awards including Time Magazine 100 Most Influential List (2006), The Ramon Magsaysay Award (2007), The Lantos Human Rights Prize (2012), the UK Parliament's Westminster Award (2013), the Geneva Summit for Human Rights and Democracy Courage Award (2014), the Truman-Reagan Freedom Medal from the Victims of Communism Memorial Foundation (2015), the Leopoldo Lopez Freedom and Democracy Award from Kenyon College (2021), and the Bradley Foundation's Bradley Prize (2022). He serves as Distinguished Fellow at the Catholic University of America, Distinguished Senior Fellow in Human Rights at the Witherspoon Institute, and Senior Distinguished Advisor to the Lantos Foundation for Human Rights and Justice. Chen's memoir The Barefoot Lawyer: A Blind Man's Fight for Justice and Freedom in China was published in 2015.

EDUCATION

VOC is online, in the classroom, and in communities, educating about the perils of communism through lectures and events, teacher trainings and seminars, our award-winning mini documentary series, *Witness Project*, and curricular materials that a growing number of states are adopting as part of their civics education.

RESEARCH

VOC scholars produce leading research on the atrocities of communism, past and present. Reaching hundreds of millions of citizens worldwide in dozens of languages, our China, Latin America, and Polish Studies programs expose the truth about the brutality of communism.

OUTREACH

VOC supports the bipartisan Victims of Communism Congressional Caucus and Victims of Communism Memorial Day (November 7), provides human rights education and a platform for dissidents to teach and testify, fosters ongoing dialogue through the annual Captive Nations Summit, and advocates for all in their struggle for freedom against totalitarianism.

REMEMBRANCE

VOC maintains the Victims of Communism Memorial near the U.S. Capitol, operates the Victims of Communism Museum located two blocks from the White House, and brings art displays and public exhibitions to schools and communities around the country.
